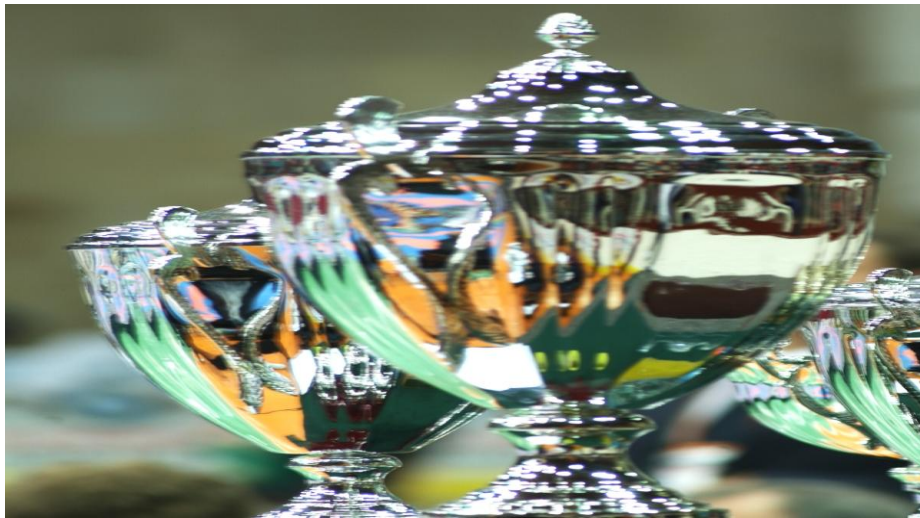

TEMPORAL CROWN ARE NICE! ***BUT STRIVE FOR THE SPIRITUAL CROWNS:***

- 1) **Incorruptible Crown: (For Self Discipline)** (I Cor 9:25-27) To those who master the corrupt nature
 - A. In the early Olympic Games, the prize won by the victor was a crown of olive leaves. Naturally, with the heat of the day, the crown withered. The apostle Paul contrasts that incident with the Christian life. “Now they do it to obtain a corruptible crown; but we an incorruptible.” (Towns 793)
- 2) **Crown of Rejoicing: (For Faithful Witnessing and Fruit-bearing)** (I Thess 2:19,20; Prov 11:30) To the soul winners.
 - A. Every Christian should receive the crown of rejoicing
- 3) **Crown of Life: (Martyr’s Crown)** (James 1:12; Rev 2:10) To those who endure temptation
 - A. [Perhaps] is speaking of those whose service cost them their lives. (Towns 794)
- 4) **Crown of Righteousness: (Faithful in Light of Christ’s Return)** (II Tim 4:8) To those who love the doctrine of the rapture
 - A. This was probably what Dwight L. Moody was thinking of when on his deathbed, as he passed into eternity he said “This is my coronation (crowning of a monarch) day.” (Towns 794)
- 5) **Crown of Glory** (I Pet 5:2-4) For Pastors and Teachers
